<i>September 28, 1946</i>	“39, 827 see Zale knock out Graziano and retain world middleweight honors”
<i>December 21, 1946</i>	“Robinson beats Bell on points for world welterweight title before 15,670”
<i>July 17, 1947</i>	“Graziano knocks out Zale in sixth round to take world middleweight title”
<i>December 6, 1947</i>	“Louis, floored twice, beats Walcott on split decision”
<i>June 26, 1948</i>	“Joe Louis rallies to stop Walcott in eleventh round”
<i>September 22, 1948</i>	“Cerdan captures world middleweight title by knocking out Zale in twelfth”
<i>October 30, 1948</i>	“Saddler wins world featherweight title by knocking out Pep in 4th round”
<i>June 17, 1949</i>	“La Motta wins title by knockout as Cerdan is unable to answer bell for 10th”

<i>September 6, 1960</i>	“American boxers win three gold medals at Olympics”
<i>March 14, 1961</i>	“Patterson knocks out Johansson in 6th; Retains title after being down twice”
<i>September 26, 1962</i>	“Liston knocks Patterson out in first round”
<i>November 16, 1962</i>	“Cassius Clay knocks out Moore in 4th round after flooring him 3 times”
<i>July 23, 1963</i>	“Liston halts Patterson in first and retains heavyweight title”
<i>February 26, 1964</i>	“Clay wins title in seventh-round upset as Liston is halted by shoulder injury”
<i>May 19, 1965</i>	“Harada captures world bantamweight title by outpointing Jofre”
<i>May 26, 1965</i>	“Clay knocks out Liston in one minute; Bout, like first, ends in controversy”
<i>November 15, 1966</i>	“Clay halts Williams in 1:08 of third round and keeps heavyweight title”
<i>February 7, 1967</i>	“Clay batters Terrell severely and retains crown on unanimous decision”
<i>March 23, 1967</i>	“Clay knocks out Folley at 1:48 of 7th round to retain heavyweight title”
<i>April 29, 1967</i>	“Clay refuses army oath; Stripped of boxing crown”
<i>September 30, 1967</i>	“Griffith regains middleweight title on majority decision over Benvenuti”
<i>March 5, 1968</i>	“Frazier stops Mathis in 11th and Benvenuti outpoints Griffith in title bouts”
