<i>September 21, 1913</i>	“Ouimet World’s Golf Champion”
<i>October 15, 1916</i>	“Jim Barnes gets Wanamaker Trophy”

<i>November 6, 1927</i>	“Hagen keeps title; beats Turnesa, 1 up”

<i>April 11, 1949</i>	“Snead, displaying brilliant putting, annexes Masters golf with card of 282”
<i>June 12, 1950</i>	“Hogan wins U.S Open golf in a remarkable comeback”
<i>April 9, 1951</i>	“Hogan captures Masters golf for first time, beating Riegel by 2 strokes”
<i>June 17, 1951</i>	“Hogan retains U.S Open title by shooting keen 67 on final round”
<i>April 13, 1953</i>	“Hogan captures Masters golf event second time with record 274”
<i>June 14, 1953</i>	“Hogan, with a 283, takes fourth U.S Open golf title”
<i>July 11, 1953</i>	“Hogan British victor; final 68 sets record”
<i>April 13, 1954</i>	“Snead beats Hogan in play-off for his third Masters golf title”

<i>June 22, 1971</i>	“Trevino’s 68 defeats Nicklaus by 3 strokes in Open play-off”
<i>July 11, 1971</i>	“Trevino wins British Open golf by shot with 278”
<i>April 10, 1972</i>	“Nicklaus wins his 4th Masters title by 3 shots on final 74 for 286 total”
<i>June 19, 1972</i>	“Nicklaus wins U.S Open by 3 strokes”
<i>August 7, 1972</i>	“Gary Player regains P.G.A crown, carding 72 for 281 and 2-shot edge”
<i>June 18, 1973</i>	“Miller’s record 63 for 279 total wins U.S Open golf title”
<i>August 12, 1974</i>	“Trevino captures P.G.A title by stroke with 276 as Nicklaus takes 2d place”
<i>April 14, 1975</i>	“40-foot birdie putt at 16 helps Nicklaus win his 5th Masters”
<i>July 10, 1977</i>	“Watson, on 65 – 268, wins British Open; Nicklaus 2d on 269”
<i>July 16, 1978</i>	“Nicklaus takes 3d British Open”
<i>June 16, 1980</i>	“Nicklaus takes Open a 4th time on record 272”
<i>August 11, 1980</i>	“Nicklaus captures P.G.A crown for a fifth time”
