<i>June 29, 1914</i>	“Heir to Austrian throne, Archduke Ferdinand, and wife slain by assassin”
<i>July 29, 1914</i>	“War declared by Austria against Servia; Russia will help Serbs to resist invasion”
<i>August 2, 1914</i>	“War against Russia declared by Kaiser; France orders army mobilization”
<i>August 3, 1914</i>	“Armies of four great powers of Europe clash in a death struggle”
<i>August 4, 1914</i>	“War between powers of Europe now rages on land and sea and in the air”
<i>August 5, 1914</i>	“England hurls defiant declaration of war at Germany”
<i>August 6, 1914</i>	“Thousands of German troops killed and wounded”
<i>August 21, 1914</i>	“Belgians give up capital, retreat to Antwerp”
<i>August 29, 1914</i>	“English North Sea fleet destroys three German cruisers”
<i>September 11, 1914</i>	“Germans rolled back 37 miles under Allies’ fierce attack”
<i>September 30, 1914</i>	“Allies hammer German right wing; Gen. Von Kluck reported in retreat”
<i>October 11, 1914</i>	“Germans’ new plan of campaign is aimed at England”
<i>October 17, 1914</i>	“Allies extend lines to sea as Germans occupy Bruges and Ostend”
<i>October 30, 1914</i>	“Turkey opens war on Russia by bombarding Black Sea city”
<i>December 10, 1914</i>	“British fleet wins battle in South Atlantic, destroying 3 cruisers and 2,000 sailors”
<i>December 17, 1914</i>	“German cruisers shell British cities and escape after fighting pursuers”
<i>January 20, 1915</i>	“Zeppelins raid British towns, hurling bombs; Try to kill Royalty”
<i>January 25, 1915</i>	“German cruiser Blucher sunk in North Sea battle; Two others are damaged”
<i>May 8, 1915</i>	“Steamer Lusitania torpedoed and sunk off Irish coast”
<i>May 11, 1915</i>	“President, firm for peace, will rebuke Berlin; Germany extends official regrets”
<i>May 13, 1915</i>	“United States asks reparation from Germany”
<i>May 14, 1915</i>	“U.S. note of protest is sent to Berlin; Germany expected here to yield”

<i>May 24, 1915</i>	“Italy opens war on Austria and wins the first clash between frontier forces”
<i>May 31, 1915</i>	“Germany in reply to U.S. demands withholds final decision”
<i>June 11, 1915</i>	“President asks Germany to give formal assurances that measures will be taken to safeguard American ships and lives in sea war zones”
<i>July 24, 1915</i>	“American note, delivered in Berlin, warns the German government against future attacks; U.S. to defend rights wherever violated”
<i>August 6, 1915</i>	“Warsaw captured by German troops”
<i>August 15, 1915</i>	“Germany’s secret intrigues to involve the United States in Great War”
<i>August 22, 1915</i>	“Italy declares war on Turkey, will attack Dardanelles”
<i>September 26, 1915</i>	“Allies start on great drive in West”
<i>November 7, 1915</i>	“Bulgars take Serb capital; Capture of Nish opens road from Danube to Bosphorus”
<i>February 11, 1916</i>	“War Secretary quits after sharp difference with Wilson”
<i>February 24, 1916</i>	“Six miles of trenches taken by Germans in dash against Verdun”
<i>March 3, 1916</i>	“Fierce Verdun drive renewed; Battle now rages at Douaumont”
<i>June 3, 1916</i>	“Six English cruisers sunk; Germans lose 4 cruisers, 2 dreadnoughts”
<i>June 7, 1916</i>	“Earl Kitchener and his staff killed at sea when English cruiser Hampshire is sunk”
<i>July 2, 1916</i>	“British and French begin big drive; English thrust wedge in five miles”
<i>December 13, 1916</i>	“Germany makes offer of peace, will restore conquered lands except Poland and Lithuania ”
<i>February 1, 1917</i>	“German note to America defies world on seas; Proclaims ruthless submarine war”
<i>February 4, 1917</i>	“United States and Germany near to actual war”
<i>February 27, 1917</i>	“Two American women reported lost on the Laconia, torpedoed without warning”
<i>March 1, 1917</i>	“German plot to conquer U.S. with aid of Japan and Mexico revealed”
<i>March 12, 1917</i>	“Bagdad is captured by the British forces; Brings joy to London”
<i>March 16, 1917</i>	“Czar yields throne as revolt by people and army triumphs”
<i>March 19, 1917</i>	“U-boats sink 3 U.S. ships; 22 American sailors missing”
<i>April 3, 1917</i>	“Germany making war upon U.S.”

<i>April 5, 1917</i>	“United States and Germany at war, Senate declares by a vote of 82 to 6”
<i>April 6, 1917</i>	“House defeats efforts to prevent sending army abroad and votes for war”
<i>April 17, 1917</i>	“French capture 10,000 prisoners and 25 miles of German lines”
<i>April 29, 1917</i>	“Great American army to fight Germany will be raised by selective draft”
<i>June 14, 1917</i>	“Air raiders kill 97 in London; 437 injured as 15 panes flash over East End”
<i>June 28, 1917</i>	“First American army reaches French port under guard of navy”
<i>August 1, 1917</i>	“French and British, in smashing drive, sweep over German lines in Flanders”
<i>August 29, 1917</i>	“President Wilson rejects Pope’s peace proposal”
<i>October 30, 1917</i>	“Teutons near Udine; Italians check foes as Allies hasten aid”
<i>November 9, 1917</i>	“Kerensky, deposed, a fugitive; Radicals seize Petrograd, jail five of Cabinet”
<i>November 22, 1917</i>	“Haig smashes through Hindenburg line; French open drive north of Aisne”
<i>December 5, 1917</i>	“War with Austria to be swift response to President’s message”
<i>December 7, 1917</i>	“2,000 killed when French munitions vessel explodes in harbour of Halifax”
<i>March 22, 1918</i>	“Germans open drive on 50 miles of British front”
<i>March 24, 1918</i>	“Breaking British front, Huns advance 9 miles – shells reach Paris”
<i>March 26, 1918</i>	“British retire slowly with unbroken front, inflicting huge loss on Huns”
<i>April 22, 1918</i>	“Americans win back trenches in all-night battle”
<i>April 24, 1918</i>	“British naval raiders storm U-boat bases”
<i>June 1, 1918</i>	“Germans reach Marne on 10-mile front; Battle spreads both east and westward”
<i>June 12, 1918</i>	“Americans take 300 prisoners, 2 guns and win Belleau wood”
<i>June 24, 1918</i>	“Austrians, routed by foe and flood, in peril on Piave; French praise Americans”
<i>June 27, 1918</i>	“Americans, at bayonet point, take 264 prisoners in wood”
<i>July 16, 1918</i>	“American counter attacks drive Germans back to Marne, taking 1,500 prisoners”
<i>July 19, 1918</i>	“Americans and French take 20 towns, thousands of prisoners and scores of guns”
<i>July 20, 1918</i>	“U.S. cruiser sunk off New York, probably by U-boat; 335 men landed”
<i>July 21, 1918</i>	“Germans flee across Marne, crushed by fierce attacks”

<i>July 22, 1918</i>	“French and Americans smash Hun lines; Advance over three miles”
<i>August 5, 1918</i>	“Americans take Fismes after terrific fight”
<i>August 11, 1918</i>	“Americans carry Chipilly spur; French make haul of Germans, taking Montdidier”
<i>August 30, 1918</i>	“British get Bapaume; Close in on Peronne”
<i>September 3, 1918</i>	“British, in fiercest fighting war has seen, crush 10 miles of Wotan line”
<i>September 13, 1918</i>	“Americans, sweeping into St. Mihiel salient, take Thiaucourt and other towns”

<i>November 1, 1918</i>	“Turkey out of war; Disaster to Austrian arms; Empire falling”
<i>November 2, 1918</i>	“Turkey’s surrender is absolute – Slavs take Austrian fleet”
<i>November 5, 1918</i>	“Allies’ terms to Germany signed in Paris”
<i>November 10, 1918</i>	“Kaiser abdicates; Crown Prince goes too; Regency to be set up”
<i>November 11, 1918</i>	“Reds seize government after battle in Berlin; All Germany joining revolt”
<i>November 12, 1918</i>	“Terms of the Armistice in full”
